REPORTING PROCEDURES FOR RECORD FISH

A record of the largest fish of each species taken by hook and line in West Virginia waters is maintained. Certificates of accomplishment are awarded for each record holder.

Any angler landing a potential record breaker should report his catch to Wildlife Resources Section, Division of Natural Resources, 324 4th Ave; South Charleston, WV 25303. A photograph of the fish is desirable (color preferred). A WV DNR fishery biologist must verify the species of fish.
